AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY FOR FUNDING FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, MARITIME ADMINISTRATION (MARAD), AMERICA'S MARINE HIGHWAY PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Northern Virginia Regional Commission has been involved in the coordination of a regional response to the transportation congestion and as a result of the growth experienced during the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC), through development of alternative modes to single-occupancy vehicles traveling along I-95 and Route 1; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Department of Transportation designated the M-495 as a new Marine Highway in September, 2013; with the Occoquan, Potomac, and Anacostia Rivers making up the "M-495 Marine Highway Crossing;" and

WHEREAS, In May 2014, funding was received from the Federal Transit Administration from the Ferry Boat Program, to provide for two boats and two docks on the Potomac River, requiring, however, a National Environment Protection Agency Analysis completion prior to using the funding; and

WHEREAS, NVRC released the Final Market Analysis Report for Commuter Ferry Service on the Occoquan, Potomac, and Anacostia Rivers in June 2015, identifying corridors connecting terminals with the potential for market viability; and

WHEREAS, the Maritime Administration's Marine Highways program awarded the Northern Virginia Regional Commission funding to support planning efforts focused on an Infrastructure Gap Analysis and completion of NEPA documentation for development of a new commuter ferry service on the Potomac River; and

WHEREAS, said alternatives analysis will focus on service from Woodbridge, to Joint Base Anacostia/Bolling and then into SW/SE DC.

WHEREAS, the next steps should provide development of a ferry operation; and

WHEREAS, a commuter ferry may alleviate traffic congestion on I-95 and Route 1; provide additional commuter transportation choices in lieu of few other alternatives; has the ability to move people out of Washington, DC, during emergency situations; has the ability to move freight on the river, is a more environmentally friendly commuter option than building more highway lanes; provides cheaper options than building a new bridge over the Potomac ; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Northern Virginia Regional Commission agrees to sponsor, and authorizes the Executive Director to apply for a Marine Highway grant for up to \$2,000,000.00 to support the linkages from Woodbridge to Joint Base Anacostia/Bolling and SE/SW DC to address the congestion and need for freight connection to this new employment hub.
